

SOUTH BUCKINGHAMSHIRE NETBALL ASSOCIATION County Safeguarding Officer Role Description

ROLE SUMMARY:

To be primary point of contact for any safeguarding concerns or issues arising within the County

ESTIMATED HOURS:

3-4 hours per week plus regional and national meetings when required

KEY TASKS:

- Give advice regarding the wellbeing, safeguarding and protection of young people in our County clubs
- Promote good Safeguarding practices
- Ensure the safeguarding 'Reporting a Concern' process is clearly communicated and understood within the county.
- Assist club safeguarding officers create a safe and enjoyable environment where everyone understands their safeguarding responsibilities.
- On receipt of any concerns, take appropriate action and liaise with EN's Lead
 Child Protection Officer to handle concerns
- To promote awareness of the EN Codes of Conduct and to support the implementation of safe recruitment and induction procedures within the county
- To advise on the application of EN's DBS Guidance and to be the point of contact for risk assessments and clearance communications.
- To be the first point of contact to receive information from anyone who has concerns relating to the welfare of children and young people and to record and report appropriately.
- To clarify information received, ensuring that this is referred on promptly to EN's Lead Child Protection Officer to enable assessment to be undertaken, and advice offered.
- To follow the EN Responding and Reporting a Concern Procedure and flow chart.
- To advise the clubs on appropriate training for coaches and volunteers based on the EN recommended safeguarding training requirements;
- To educate County Safeguarding Officers of their on the Reporting a Concern process and good practice in safeguarding.
